

Our Mission

In a relay race the most important part is the transition – when the baton moves from one runner's hand to the next. Cru wants **every** Christian graduate to continue on with Jesus by making a smooth transition from their present Christian community to their next Christian community after high school.

With Cru's understanding of college life from over 60 years of campus ministry and Cru's understanding of building godly family legacies from 40 years of family ministry (Family Life), Cru wants to come alongside parents to help them establish their kids in the gospel before they leave home for college. Our COUNTDOWN seminar was designed to help parents strengthen their kid's faith in the gospel before they leave home.

Current Realities

1. Most church leaders agree that when our Church kids leave high school they face real challenges in their faith:

"Among incoming freshmen, 44% said they frequently attend religious services, but by the end of their junior year, that was down to 25%."

"70% of young adults ages 23-30 stopped attending church regularly for at least a year between ages 18-22. Of those, 25 percent said, 'I moved to college and stopped attending church'. The college environment can have a dangerous effect on a Christian student's faith."

- 61% of students with Christian background stopped attending church after going regularly
- 41% have struggled with significant doubt
- 35% have rejected their parents faith

2. Research continues to show that parents play the most influential role in their child's Christian faith.

"Perhaps our most significant and summative finding regarding the influence of parents is this: how you express and live your faith will have, all things being equal, a greater impact on your child's life than any other factor."

- 3. Many parents feel ineffective when it comes to discussing their faith with their teenager. When parents no longer feel they have influence in their kid's lives they either stop trying, or start controlling.
- 4. Many teens feel a growing "disconnect" with their parents. When talking with parents about important issues gets tough, teens look elsewhere for understanding and guidance. When that happens a major connection to the gospel is broken. Those who "get them" will gain their allegiance and influence how they see God and the Bible.

Seminar Details

Our Countdown seminar is typically done from 7-9 in an evening. The two-hour session is a combination of lecture, video, discussion, role-play and Q&A, and covers:

- Three qualities students need to own their faith as young adults.
- Three skills parents need to help their kids own their faith.
- Seven critical questions students need to think about during their teenage years.
- How to evaluate the spiritual environment of your child's future college campus.
